




Guests are always welcome, but any non RLS visitors or public must have a guest pass, and be escorted by a member. Compound Security and SAFETY is everyone's responsibility. **There can be NO RIDES for the PUBLIC on Friday or Saturday.** If asked, please invite them to return on Sunday at the Station starting at 10AM.

We have room for a small number of trailers or RV's inside the compound. So far, we've had no one sign up for overnight camping. If you plan to stay overnight, please contact Bill Hesse at 951-544-2740. If no one signs up, we'll need at least one member to stay over each night to provide on-site security.

Spring Meet Travel Tips From Gary -

Gary Mocko has been keeping an eye on the local Motels for the past couple of months and has this info: The Comfort Inn on University Ave changed names last month and is now a Quality Inn. Besides the sign changes, however, the hotel is exactly the same as it used to be. This also includes the Riverside Live Steamer rate of \$65/night. A reminder that you have to contact the hotel directly (not through the Choice Hotels website) and

mention that you are a member or guest of the Riverside Live Steamers to get that rate. If you are a Choice Hotels member, it will still be credited as a stay.

I'll still put this motel the 3.5-4 star range. All the rooms were completely redone about a year ago, the WiFi and TV are above average (multiple HBO and Showtime channels), there is an iron/board, coffee maker, microwave & refrigerator in every room and their complimentary breakfast is well above average (eggs, sausage, pancakes, waffles, cereal(s), etc.) with coffee/ tea in the lobby all day. There is an exercise room and a small outdoor pool. For oversized vehicles/ trailers, there is also an adjacent open (compacted dirt) parking lot that can be used by hotel guests. (Editors note: Gary recently reports that The Comfort Inn is booked up and that you may need to check frequently for room availability on the Meet dates.)

Along the Track by Rich Casford, Roadmaster

Rain did not stop the hard workers at RLS on Saturday, March 17, 2018.



The straightaway between the West Sidewalk crossing and the Big Pine Tree was again aligned by the track crew under the supervision of Surveyor Doug Prescott. This is normal after major alignment work the track crew would return to fine tune any settlement of the track.

With the good moisture in the track structure, the track crew moved to the Big Rock area south of Hunter Station and did some leveling and lifting of low joints.

The big project in the compound was the repair of the main water line. Water had to be shut off to the compound during the repair work. Compound Supervisor Bob Roberts lead a crew of diggers and pipe fitters and have the water restored by 11:30 AM.

Track inspection was conducted by the Roadmaster and found no issues for Run Day on March 25th, Westbound figure 8 track pattern.
