


Tom Lawson at the throttle of his Berkshire, helping out with passenger service on the last day of the Spring Meet.



Lots of FUN (work)DAYS in April!

The Roadmaster had a switching problem to solve. With the Spring Meet coming on at the end of April, a brand-new switch ready for installation in Allen's Valley sitting on the picnic tables on the eastside of compound and a minimum of 8 people needed to move the switch to the job site, what to do??

Road 2 decided to enlist the help of the Noble Quick Third Level welding crew, the Compound Supervisor and his team of trench diggers and a small track crew to arrive on site April 6th. The old AV#3 switch was pulled, and the new switch delivered by gondola with the help of all the extra workers. Once the new switch was set in place, the welding crew retired to the Noble Quick third level and finished all the tracks for additional storage.

While the track crew were working John Gruwell, Tiffany Love and Chris Newman welded a new fuel box on the North Fuel Lead to allow for in-line filters to be installed. Compound Supervisor Bob Roberts played Picasso and painted the fuel boxes.


Everything worked as planned on the April 14th Run Day!
