Once the donuts and coffee were finished work continued on the second crossover on the Vandenberg Extension. With a smaller but dedicated track crew, we had the track reconnected before we broke for lunch. Because of the additional work to connect the two switches, align and level the finished trackage work had to be continued after the Board of Directors meeting. Thanks to President Brian Stephens, Vice President Dave Bunts, Chris Newman and the Roadmaster we finished the project about 3:00PM Saturday. We now can operate on the large loop in case of delays in Allen's Valley or Columbia Ave yards.

## A Message from your Safety Weasel...

The lazy days of summer have hit, and the Safety Weasel is in that kind of mood as well. So, all you are going to have to remember for this months Safety Tip is "Put the lock down". Sounds like it might be Gospel tune doesn't it? Or in an attempt to hit my own age, something about "Put my Kangaroo Down Mate" sung in an Australian accent in a tune from the last century. A good portion of RLS track switches have locks installed to direct the traffic on our railroad in the proper direction for the day. Everyone hates running up on an open facing switch, and if the switch is set incorrectly, you may all of sudden find

yourself facing traffic when you least expect it, so we lock the switches. Everyone has access to a switch lock key in the clubhouse, so take one with you if you need to pull out of the normal traffic route to turn your train around, or do some work outside of the 'normal' yards. When you relock the switch, (See RULE 211(b) if your wondering why one would do such a thing) please make sure that the lock is lying flat on the switch box. It is possible to leave the lock sticking up, which is NOT a

good thing. Most of our engines have low foot pegs, and a switch standing up will hit said pegs, or even worse, the foot that is resting on said foot peg. In addition, it is possible to severely damage said foot pegs, AND, if you had heard our switch tender extraordinaire muttering, damage the switch box enough to require the entire mechanism replacement.

So -Put the lock down - it will save everyone some grief

#### More on Switches...

#### They are LOCKED not SPRUNG

When operating on the RLS Track you will see switch locks on all mainline switches in the direction of operations that day. These locks use a Master Lock key #2001. When opening and closing the switch make sure the padlock is lying flat and not up on the edge of the lock. We use these locks as when they are lying flat they are no taller than the switch throw handle. If you stand them on the edge they will catch cylinder cocks or the straddle cars used in the Hunter Train. If you see a lock on edge, stop and lay it flat. Your fellow engineers will appreciate you taking the time to fix the problem. If you need additional switch keys see the Roadmaster.

All RLS switches use springs to keep the points closed. They are NOT sprung switches that you can run through when thrown against your line of travel. You may derail and damage the switch. Stop, open the switch, proceed and then close the switch. Engineers are reminded that they are responsible for their train crews to open and close switches correctly each time
