
#### Fallen Flag

#### Along The Tracks - Rich Casford, Road 2

#### **NEW UPGRADED BLOWER CAR AT RLS**

You unload your engine, fire up and proceed out on to the mainline. Track is clear and you have a great day with live steam at RLS. However, there is another story that happens prior to most run days.

When Hunter Hobby Park was originally built, the railroad had grass on the street side of the outside loop and dirt on the inside. Our largest problem was weeds from the occasional rainstorm since the grass was only watered with an

irrigation system using above ground pipes and sprinklers.

With the 2008-2010 park remodeling project, underground sprinkler systems, grass over the majority of the flat surfaces, and trees with seasonal leaves, the need for a system to clear off the railroad was required.

Starting with leaf rakes, then switching to handheld gas and battery powered leaf blowers it required manpower to clear off the tracks prior to operations. Track clearing is not a glamorous job, however for good train operations and reduced derailment issues it is very important.

For years the Roadmaster and other "Early Risers" would do track inspections prior to run days before the majority of RLS members arrive at the compound.

We had a generator mounted on a flatcar that was used in track work when we had electric drill motors in use. I picked up a couple of electric leaf blowers, using some RR ties and C clamps, rigged up a blower

car to speed the cleaning of the track. After several months of trial & error, I figured out the proper angle for the blowers to remove the tree leaves and other trash on the track without blowing the rock ballast out from between the ties.

Tom Lebs, one our "Earlier Risers" who would inspect and clean the track on Run Days offered to take the blower car home and install proper handles and brackets. The photo is the finished product! The new blower car has the following added features: power switches to kill the power to the blowers before crossing a concrete grade crossing; adjustments for vertical and horizontal positions of the blower nozzles; storage positions for rake, broom and pick bar for grade crossing



cleaning; brackets to hold generator in place and a push handle.

Tom has done an outstanding job of design and construction on the car.

Clearing the track is not reserved just for the Roadmaster or our "Early Raisers" on Run day. If you would like to learn how to operate the new blower car, please contact me. Tom and I would be happy to share our fun!

#### 2019 Fall Meet




Thanks to our team of brakemen, Marty the flag man, and Station Master


