President's Words Of Wisdom



Along The Tracks - Rich Casford, Road 2

First FUN (work) DAY of 2020, January 18th, saw lots of activity at RLS.

The regular crew cleaned up the compound from leaves to spraying the weeds. This is a normal first project each workday to keep the compound looking good and prevent accidents with trash on the ground. Compound Supervisor Bob Roberts and Richard Miller sprayed weeds. Tom Lebs, Chris Neiman, Doug Shifter were on the leaf racks and trash bags.

Richard Ronne conducted a master switch building class for the new switches for the Vanderburg crossing replacements. We will have to start calling Richard, Tom Sawyer the fence painter or Mr. Roberts, wonderful day in the neighborhood, as not only was there a crowd around the switch jig but Kevin Zamp was shooting video! By noon the first of two new righthand switches was ready for installation.

Out on the mainline, the Roadmaster leveled, aligned and power tamped the car lead to David's Yard. The lead track had been damaged by a truck sometime in the prior week. Dan Williams and Doug Shifter moved additional ballast and started the project of widening the shoulders, so the ends of the ties were not exposed. This helps prevent kids thinking they can lift the track out of the ground when they see how shallow the ties are in the ground. Roadmaster also racked the track clean between Noble Junction and the Casford Cross-over due to heavy leaf drop off the oak tree in that area.

SMP Bunts worked on the car brake stand for the Hunter locomotive.

Car Repair Foreman Brook Adams repaired Gondola #8818 with a new king pin. Talk about dedication to his car department, the CRF "walked" the mainline looking for the missing king pin and hardware from the car at the last Run Day, found the parts, replaced the broken pieces and restored the car to full service.

John Gurwell adjusted chains on the steaming bay track locks. Storage Manager Casford adjusted storage of equipment during the annual January two-step car shuffle or how to stretch tracks with a left-hand bacon stretcher when you need three more inches to clear a coupler! NEW CAR STORAGE LOCATIONS IN BARNEY'S BARN

With the new year comes new locations for locomotive and car storage at RLS.

To better allocate track spaces based on equipment needs and operations each January storage tracks are adjusted to maximize storage.

Effective in January 2020 Floor Track #6 in Barney's Barn (the middle building) will be private car storage. Tracks are numbered at the roof line of the building.

Floor Tracks #7, #8 and #11 will hold the RLS Club gondolas that are available for use by the members or guests when they need additional cars.

To Recap: Tracks #6, #9, #10 are private owner cars and should not be used by general club members without permission of the car owners.

Tracks #7, #8 and #11 are RLS club gondolas that can be used by any member or guest on the railroad.

Floor Track #6.5 in between tracks #6 & #7 holds work equipment

Floor Track #10.5 in between tracks #10 & #11 holds extra brakeman cars
