Some maintenance work is still being performed. Our Electrical Upgrade Program headed by Steve Borcher and his team are still working on completion of items from the City Inspector Punch List. Once we pass inspection by City

Building & Safety department, then Riverside Public Utilities will move the main power drop from transformer to our new weather head going into the building. If you come out to the compound be careful in all the buildings as we have electrical construction material in several places.

Equipment Owners Note: We have new locks on buildings, containers and gates. You still need your old key for all the man doors and front gate lock. You were mailed a new key for the new locks. If you did not get a key in the past few weeks, please email Rich at rich@wmp.net or (575) 756-4413. If you enter the property make sure to close and lock the gate on the inside so we do not have public coming into the compound. Only RLS members are allowed in the Compound at this time. Please remember 10 people or less and 6-foot social distancing rules. Face coverings are required. If we do not follow these simple rules we will be suspended from access to the compound.

The Board of Directors appreciates the cooperation of the membership during our COVID-19 induced closure. As soon as we can return to the Rails, we will let you know.

The first train of the San Pedro, Los Angeles, and Salt Lake Railroad arrived at this station from Los Angeles on March 12, 1904. From Riverside the line followed the Mormon Trail to connect with the Union Pacific in Salt Lake. In 1921 the line and the station were acquired by the Union Pacific.

HOW DO YOU MOVE 30 FEET OF TRACK PANELS ON A 18 FOOT TRANSFER TABLE?



Back in the day.....before COVID-19 our track crew used to do some amazing jobs of track building and track installation.

On major jobs, we would build 30-foot sections of track, loading them on a special track transporter mounted on two flatcars. The photos show how we could move 30 feet of track off a steaming bay and onto the engine lead to the mainline. The track carrier floated on pivot points on the flat cars.

Designed and built by Phil McFadden, George Bartlow and Dave Bunts. Phil & Dave are all smiles as they move a load of trackage, ready for field installation.


This process sure beats hauling 10-foot sections at a time and the resulting kneeling work in the field connecting each section.
