CLUB BY-LAWS - Through the courtesy of Ted Cranford, a copy of the By-Laws has been prepared for each member of RLS, and your copy is enclosed. Please read it carefully. It outlines the policies under which your club operates.

MARCH 18 WORK DAY Eighteen members turned out to tackle a number of projects. Assisting Jim Keith on the station work were Richard Stokes, George Hildebrandt (all 1" scale men incidentally) who put up the roof panels, started the laying of the roofing paper and shakes. Bob Babb and John Piatt were hard at work restoring Barney Root's 2-8-4 to operating condition. Louis Thomas took in on the huge stack of ties that needed cleaning and stripping of old spikes. Ken Kepner got out the paint rollers and primed five roof panels, then grabbed a hammer to assist Louie Thomas. John Keith had the saw going, Sir Francis doing his dado on the dado cutter with Al Easley moving material for the tie operation while cleaning up the compound. Between these men working on the ties, 1000 ties are now ready for use!!

Out on the track, under the eagle eye of John Noble, Ted Cranford, Truson Buegel, John Powelson, Jack Sessums, Barney Root, Carl Allen and Ken Casford raked the track, worked on rough joints, installed track bolts, installed ballast retainers, realigned track and in general, made a lot of headway on catching up on deferred maintenance.

These eighteen workers put in a good day's work, and I am certain all felt a real feeling of accomplishment when they went home that night. Several other members showed up for a couple of hours, but seemed to be content with supervising or visiting. Fellows, you would be surprised at what the majority of the 18 workers had to say about those who stood around and watched the others work! Run day is a time for visiting, but when there is ample work to be done, workers only please!

OPERATING RULES As a reminder, $1\frac{1}{2}$ " locomotives and trains have the right of way over 1" locomotives and trains at the crossing. Engineers on the 1" trains should stop at a distance away from the crossing as a matter of courtesy (and safety) so that $1\frac{1}{2}$ " engineers know you are aware of their train.
