The lack of a cover picture showing RLS operations again emphasizes the many, many hours put into maintenance and repair this summer by a small dedicated group of RLS members. While this hard work has resulted in greatly reduced operations, much good has come out of our problems as we now have 1,320 feet of new track in the ground that we did not have at the beginning of the year.

<u>DAMAGED TRACK REPLACED</u> Over the weekend of September 16-17, a number of members turned out to repair and replace the vandalized main lines. The 1" crew restored all of the damaged 1" track and switch as well as raising the line about 4" under the overpass. The 1-1/2" crew replaced a switch and 260' of track. Our thanks to those members who took the time and effort to pitch in on this vital work.

Due to possibility of track being tied up, and work needed to be done for the October three day meet, it is hoped that Saturday can be used to concentrate on track work as there will be only three weekends available for work before the October meet. AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FOR ALL RLS MEMBERS:

Summer 1972 has been a rough period for RLS what with widespread construction in the park and destruction of the tunnel trackage the last of July requiring an urgent program to complete the tunnel by-pass. However, with dedication of 21 members who have put in many many long, hot hours, more than 960' of RLS because of the heat.
These 21 members put aside personal discomfort and inconvenience to insure that trains could once again roll for the enjoyment of all.

With great anticipation for starting train service on the second Sunday of each month effective September 10, members Krohne, Piatt, Babb, Francis Smith and Ken Casford were ready to start this new service this past Sunday. But anticipation was short lived.

Some time during the night of September 9, vandals tore up 20' of track east of the Marlborough crossing pad. This track was located nearly a block away in an orange grove. Saddened by the sight, engineer Krohne with passengers Smith and Casford reversed their trip to check out the lower loop only to find approximately 60' of the 1" main line under the overpass torn out of the ground, bent and kinked, including a switch pulled out of a concrete base. Down the hill to the l=l-1/2" crossing revealed that 60' of l-1/2" track including the switch where the lower loop joins the main line had been completely destroyed! In addition, the compound was entered and one truck from the l-1/2" set for the weed car had been stolen.

The police and city officials of Riverside have stepped up plans to increase patrolling of the park, and we hope that they will be successful in stopping this wanton and stupid destruction of RLS track.

While comprehensive plans are being put into operation by Riverside officials, it is urgent that as many members as possible turn out this <u>Saturday</u>, <u>September 16</u>, for our regularly scheduled work day so repairs may be made to the railroad. With sufficient members on hand, not only can we repair this damage, but great strides can be made in completing the work in time for the October 21-22-23 run day which is only four weekends away!!!!

Please plan to be on hand by 9:00 a.m., Saturday, and bring with you a screwdriver and pliers for tightening rail bolts; a leaf rake for raking the right-of-way; and shovels for helping raise low rail joints and digging up weeds in the track. We will concentrate on the outer 1-1/2" main line and 1" trackage. As soon as this trackage has been worked on, the lower 1-1/2" loop and general house cleaning will be all that is necessary to complete before our visitors arrive.

Our first three day regional run day is just around the corner, and with a little effort from a lot of members, the work necessary to have us in good shape will not be a burden on anyone. We have 26 members in the local area who have not participated in any work days this year, and we are specially asking for your participation in the few remaining work weekends before our meet. We will be working every weekend between now and October 15 making preparations. Won't you spare at least two weekends for RLS between now and then?

This fall meet will be a new experience for all of us at RLS. With all of us pitching in and doing our share to make our guests welcome and to encourage them to return in the future, the stature of RLS will be greatly enhanced throughout the country. This is our chance to show the rest of the country that RLS is second to none!

The following is a breakdown of our major responsibilities for the meet, and you are requested to indicate work areas that you prefer. Every effort will be made to set up work assignments to insure that each member will have an opportunity to work as well as enjoy the meet. We need at least 8 hours of service from each member, and efforts will be made to set up assignments so you are assigned to only one four hour shift per day. If you cannot be at the club on all three days, please indicate those days you will be there.

As it is customary for the host club to allow guests maximum use of the trackage, certain changes in our operating procedures will be made and you will be advised of these changes as time draws near. In accordance with our long standing regulations, all hauling of the general public will be restricted to RLS operated trains. A separate operation for registered guests will be set up to insure their having maximum opportunities to ride over the RLS trackage.
