The first month of the year is



EXTRA RUN DAYS AND NIGHTS

- 1. April 7, 2024 Operations Meet: What does this entail? We are going to run the railroad as if we are a full-size railroad with car movements and passenger trains. We will first start out with a small group (but all are invited to help or observe) so we can practice and learn to see if this can work for us.
- 2. April 20, 2024 Work Day Evening Run: Work Day starts at 8:00am. If you are participating in the evening run you must be at the Work Day by 9:00am and ready to work on the railroad. This gives our folks that live a long distance away a chance to get to the club and participate. NO running until work is complete and NO Bench Warmers... with the exception of those with disabilities. We can find something for them to do.
- 3. May 5, 2024: Operations Meet II This will be the second Operations Meet. Yes, it is two months in a row. This should give us enough time to revise and reconfigure if we need to from the trial run.
- 4. June 1, 2024 All Day and Night Run: East/West Bound Figure-Eight and Long Train Pull

Why? So that you can have an opportunity to pull as much as you think you and your engine can handle up and down the grades.

- 5. July 6, 2024 Night Run: Typical Bidirectional, L. at Bottom, R. at Top
- 6. August 3, 2024 Night Run: Typical Bidirectional, L. at Bottom, R. at Top
- 7. August 31, 2024 through September 2, 2024

From the Compound Supervisor/Security

After the rain we had early in the year it was decided it was time to start the trench from the propane tank storage containers to the corner of Noble/Quick building. Early Friday January 17th I started with a trenching shovel and Randy started with his backhoe. We cleared the gravel off of the surface in the trench line and started digging. It turned out to be a long grueling day. Despite the rain, the ground was very hard packed from all of the vehicle traffic the area gets. In the end

we managed to get all of the trench completed by 15:30 hrs. We then started gluing and laying the conduit.

By 16:30 we finished putting the conduit and box in place and started filling in the trench. As a precaution we





laid yellow "Caution Buried Electric Line" tape on top of the protective sand layer. This stuff works! We found the Blue tape for the water and air lines within six inches of where we expected to find it. We buried, tamped, scrapped, and smoothed until

1845 and decided to call it a night.

The next morning (Saturday 1/13/24) several brave workers came out to finish the area with fresh gravel and dig out the area outside the gate to David's Yard. This involved removing several old RR ties and replacing them after the dirt was removed.

From The Back Shop

Update on the C16

In a moment of insanity, I volunteered to take the chassis of the RLS C16 2-8-0 to my shop to make repairs and upgrades to get the locomotive operational again. I normally spend about 40 hours a month in my shop. I'm currently constructing a Railroad Supply 4-4-0. I will devote about 8 hours a month working on the C16. I plan to bring it back to RLS running on air.

Photo 1 shows the chassis ready to be loaded into my trailer after this year's Fall Meet. There was some difficulty moving the chassis because the lead truck was removed.

I already had rebuilt the valve gear rods and the link. I also turned new drivers to their initial size. The drivers currently on the chassis are 7 inches in diameter, with all wheels flanged. The new drivers will be $7 \frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, with the two center drivers blind.





Photo 2 shows the eccentrics currently on the second axle. The boss on one of the reverse eccentrics has been broken. One of the forward eccentrics has a crack. The eccentrics are cast iron. Hopefully I will only need to replace these two.

I removed the side rods to check for wear (Photo 3). Fortunately, there was little wear except for the bearing on one side of the connecting rod between the third driver and the fourth. I will replace the bearing and bolt. Photo 4







Photo 5 shows the rebuilt front truck. A special thanks goes Sean Hagen who rebuilt the truck. The wheel diameters needed to be increase because the new drivers will be



a ½ inch larger in diameter.

I checked the brakes. Only one set of drivers had brakes, which were very worn. There is no room to have brakes on the third set of drivers. I will fabricate links for brakes for the first and second set of drivers. Photo 6



Next item to check will be the spring rigging. I hope I can reuse the axles and crank pins.
