Run Day October 13th

Engineers, conductors, and train crews at RLS are always on the lookout for stray soccer balls, foul soft balls, and children piling rocks on the tracks during our busiest Run Days at Hunter Park, but this day was a day to watch out for darts instead... Nerf darts that is.



War was amidst between assault teams in Palm Garden. Heavily armed commando teams were advancing on one another taking cover behind inflatable boulders and other obstacles while passenger trains filled to capacity proceeded with vigilance. Luckily, SMP Scott Horgan stepped in between warring factions to form a compact that allowed for the safe passage of RLS travelers. Railroad operations subsequently proceeded Eastbound Outside Loop without incident.

It was a sparkling 65°F sunny day for the 4 trains out occupying mainline positions in the morning. Engineer and CEO Brook Adams operated #5057 for the entire shift with Jim Woods as conductor while Engineers Sean Hagen, Rich Ronne, and Jery Vargas split duties on #733. Together, both trains boarded 616 passengers during their 5-hour shifts where afternoon temps reached 86°F. In addition, SMP Horgan supervised the train crew of Nick Ellis, Tom Ballard, and Jason Ballard on Doug Prescott's #1402 for Birthday Train operations during which Engineer Richard Miller moved freight on #573. Two locomotives were on the steaming bays for service including Mark Spaulding with #509 and Bob Chamberlain with the #573 Berkshire. No injuries were reported during mainline operations from the conflict zone.

The station was flurrying with hundreds of travelers departing from the platform, however, Station Master Glenn Maness kept order with the assistance of Tiffany Love, Tom Crue, Sam Ferguson, and Mark Ferguson. A huge highlight of



the day was the surprise visit of RLS Member Ken Mitoma. He was in attendance covering the 4-Track crossing while his new wife supervised his work. Other hands-on-deck included Jerry Roth protecting the compound throughout rail operations as well as Chris Neiman handling OS responsibilities. Collectively, there were 23 members and 4 guests in attendance. Just know... it was the perfect day, with the perfect staff in the perfect place to run the imperfect technology of live steam. C16 Update October 2024

One of the lessons I learned from doing this project is to measure everything and not make any assumptions that everything is the same measurement. In the case of the front driver crank pins, after examining the cause of the clicking sound, I found that the front crank pins should be 0.030 inches shorter than the other crank pins. To correct this, I plan on dropping the front drivers and either making new crank pins or having them shortened on a surface grinder. That should happen in the next month or so. Photos 1 and 2 show loading the



chassis on to the back of my pickup. I made the stand, which has a 8 ton hydraulic jack that can raise the top rails to a height of 40 inches.



I can lower the lift to 20 inches, which is just the right height of my trailer. Photo 3 shows the chassis back at RLS.

In the near future, the Supervisor of Motive Power (SMP) and I will place the boiler on the chassis and do the necessary plumbing to get the engine back on the rails once again.

This project was a great learning experience for me. Having to figure out how to make parts that would work correctly without any plans was a satisfying challenge.



My next project will be retrofitting my oil burning locomotive to burn propane. I hope to have this done in the next several months. My goal is to take it to the Train Mountain 2025 Tri-Annual.
