



Along the Tracks

Run Day November 10th, during normal

public train operations, we discovered the Noble Junction switch #1 had developed a worn frog. This wear point was starting to cause wheels to catch as the train passed through the switch.

As luck would have it, Master Switch Builder Richard Ronne had a brand-new right-hand switch in the compound ready for installation.

Saturday, November 16, 2024, the RLS track gang assembled to replace the NJ#1 switch. With the recent rain the day before, the work zone was perfect for track work.



It had been several months since the track gang had replaced a switch; however the skill sets were not lost on the crew. Within two and half hours the new switch was installed ready for the night run later that day.

Timing is everything in the railroad business. To complete David's Yard realignment for the new third level left, one additional used right-hand switch was needed. With the replacement of the NJ#1 switch before it had become damaged beyond use, the track department will be able to use the old

switch to complete the yard alignment project.

After returning to the compound, part of track crew spread DG across five of the car storage tracks, Track E – I, under the lift zone for better walking surface. With the coming winter rain, the DG will set up for a smooth surface.

December 14, 2024, will be our next Work (FUN) Day at RLS. Our plan will be to continue alignment work in David's Yard. Depending on the track crew turn out, we might finish the project before Christmas.

Plan now to join us! Tom Lebs will be our chef for the day providing lunch at Noon to the workers, with the new Board of Directors meeting to follow at 1:00PM. Come out and enjoy your railroad friends and help improve RLS

STORAGE BUILDINGS ARE FULL!

The RLS Storage buildings are full so please do not bring any equipment out to put in the buildings if you see an open track. Every track is rented at this time. If you need storage, please let me know so I can put you on the waiting list.

The third level lift for the Noble Quick Building should be finished in early 2025 which will open additional storage space for cars and improve locomotive track availability.

The RLS Board of Directors adjusted the storage rates in 2024.

Locomotive tracks: \$12.00 per foot per year. (transfer table access)

Floor tracks in Noble Quick Building: \$7.00 per foot per foot

Floor tracks in Babb's Building and Barney Barn: \$5.00 per foot

Shelf tracks via bridge: \$5.00 per foot

Those members who do have stored equipment at RLS will be receiving their storage invoice soon. I will be making some small adjustments in track assignments to use every spare inch of track space.

Run Day November 10th

The first run day of November brought in a beautiful Fall blue sky day! Richard Ronne was acting O.S. for John Gurwell and got his day started promptly at 7:30am.

Passenger service was handled by the ever present #733 with Sean Hagen and Anthony McBride alternating as Engineer and Conductor. Hunter Engineer training continued with Tom Crue firing the 5057 and taking it the first passenger lap. Jim Wood took care of the Conductor duties for the morning shift.



At the station; Marty Berg covered the four track crossing, Tiffany Love was at the merchandise cart, general platform duties were handled by John Gurwell, Chris Neiman and Tom Crue, and Station Master Glenn Maness was there to oversee it all. The afternoon shift on the Hunter train was taken care of by Engineer Rich Casford with

Conductor Jery Vargas taking the rear of the train.

Out on the railroad representing freight service was Bob Chamberlain at the throttle of #762. Pat O'Guinn took a few laps on the cushion of 2-6-0. Nick Ellis ran a few laps on Doug Prescott's Pacific and Richard Miller had Chuck Kennemer's 2-6-0 out as well. Engineer Tiffany Love took a passenger lap at the throttle of Sean's Consolidation and Jim Kreider got some seat time in on #762.



As we operate in a public park, RLS train crew are always on the lookout for issues or obstructions on the railway. This Run Day threw a bit of a curve ball at the 733 passenger train with five wild burros blocking the entrance to Palm Garden. Anthony McBride opened up the whistle to let the equines know that the need to move along and so they did!

Run Day November 24th

The second Run Day in November was a bit cooler with a higher humidity for the day which was great for live steam railroading! Richard Ronne was Operating Superintendent of the day that finished off with 546 passenger going through the station.

Moving those passengers along were the team of Sean Hagen and Anthony McBride at the throttle of Sean's 2-8-0. On the Hunter train for the day were Engineer Brook Adams with Conductors Jim Woods, Jery Vargas and Sam Ferguson finishing off the day.



Hunter Engineer training continued with Kevin Zamp get some cushion time in the morning. Out on the railroad enjoying the live steam hobby were Jonathan Rohrbach on his 0-4-0 vertical, Warren Peterson took a few laps behind his Mikado, Richard Miller was at the throttle of Charlie Kennemer's Mogul, Doug Prescott rolled out his narrow gauge 2-8-2, back in the steaming bay Dan Williams and David Moore worked on David's Challenger locomotive. The Station crew of the day were Station Master Glenn Maness, Tiffany Love on the merchandise cart, Chris Neiman and John Gurwell taking care of the platform and Marty Berg overseeing the four track crossing.

Know Your RLS By-Laws

I want to thank all the members who were able to vote on the updated By-Laws at the Annual November Meeting. In case you were not able to attend, the club voted in favor of the committee approved, board approved, and attorney reviewed By-Laws that members of RLS have been working on all year. The new 2024 RLS By-Laws will be posted by January 1st on the members' area of the website or you may email me for a copy.

There wasn't anything overwhelmingly monumental changed in the document. Most of the changes were spelling, capitalization, grammar, punctuation, format, and labeling to make the language consistent throughout the entire document. However, there were about 10 content changes made and you can find where these changes are in the Dates of Revision in the Appendix on the very last page.

One example of a content change included a change in the treasurer section from "check" to "account." In the old days, everything was actually paid with checks from a checking account. Today, of course, many of the club's bills are paid from online accounts. So, this was just a matter of bringing the language up-to-date for 2025.

Another change was to our Roadmaster's duties in Section 6.1. The old language said the Roadmaster was responsible for all organization "owned" facilities and equipment. Now, the Roadmaster is in charge of all organization "owned, controlled, and/or operated" facilities and equipment. You're welcome, Rich! Obviously, this doesn't change what the Roadmaster was already handling, just clarifies the job and, most importantly, aligns the language to other areas of the By-Laws.

What about this... How many types of membership do you think RLS offers? Some might say two types like Regular member and Non-resident Member. Others might say three. Both answers, though, are incorrect. There are 4 types of memberships within RLS: Regular Member, Junior Member, Non-resident member, and Honorary Member.

Well, if you stuck through this article, maybe you know a little more about the By-Laws. So, as George W. Bush famously said standing on the deck of the USS Abraham Lincoln in May 2003, "Mission Accomplished!" Oh, wait a minute...
